## **NZ Seniors Championship**

Last week's event was a resounding success. The weather conditions were ideal, with just enough wind to keep the players guessing.

A full field of 166 players including 45 internationals competed in this 54-hole event. Stu Duff (Hasting Golf Club) won with a 4-under par 212, four shots better than former Canterbury player Brent Paterson, who shot the low round of the tournament on Saturday (67). Equal third were Nelson's Craig Newman and Fielding's Anthony Chettleburgh with the leading Cantabrian being Peter Brinsdon from Pegasus and John Sanders, the leading Christchurch member.

Following the NZ Seniors tournament, teams of 12 players from New Zealand and Australia battled it out to win the coveted Sanctuary Cove Trophy.

The matches are played along the lines of the Ryder cup format where on day 1 there were matches of Foursomes and Fourball and day 2 consisted of 12 singles matches.

After the morning foursomes NZ held a 4–2 advantage which they extended to 7.5/4.5 after the Fourball. The Aussies came back strong in the singles but couldn't quite close the gap and NZ prevailed 12.5 to 11.5.

The match was played in great spirit between 2 highly competitive teams.

#### Interclub:

- The **9 Hole Mixed** met Kaiapoi at Avondale and had the narrowest of wins. Sally Young returned the best score contributing 17 Stableford points and Christchurch won a low scoring game 53 to 52. Although it was hot, the course was in fine condition. Well done.
- The **18 Hole Women** met Hororata at Waimakariri Gorge. The Captain, Gill Davis, described the event as 'A beautiful day out in the country, but unfortunately a 2.5 to 3.5 loss for Christchurch'. There was some very close play with the result hinging on the last putt, which unfortunately slipped by. It was a stroke hole to Hororata and the game was halved. Earlier, one of our Silver players found her match ending just before her final stroke hole. These two incidents highlight the importance of appropriate positioning of stroke indices in match play and how they can influence the result.

# Ambrose Day - Sunday 25th February

This event aims to set the score for the Lowest Round Ever at Shirley. Teams of 4 should be in age-group ranges as last year. (20–24, 25-29, 30-34 etc). Last year the record was set by the 60-64-year-old Men's group, with a 57. Note that groups with mixed-age players may only enter the 'Open' age group

Mens or Womens teams are both welcome. Tee times are from 9.45 - 11.30 am. Enter via Rick in the office. Entries close Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> Feb at 10am.

#### **Stroke Indices**

The Men's and Women's Committees appreciate that several the members are concerned about the recent changes to the Stroke Indices. The changes were based on recommendations from the R&A on the allocation of Strokes, (<a href="https://www.randa.org/Guidance-on-Running-a-Competition/Rules/8-Miscellaneous-Matters/SubRules/5-Stroke-Index">https://www.randa.org/Guidance-on-Running-a-Competition/Rules/8-Miscellaneous-Matters/SubRules/5-Stroke-Index</a>), recommendations from Sir Bob Charles, work undertaken by Tom Music and Rick Vincent on how men and women, low and high handicappers, play the holes, together with input from the Men's and Women's Committees and NZ Golf. The discussions took place last year with a view to implementation when the Board had made the decision as to which 9-hole loops would be played in 2018.

It is important to appreciate that **Stroke Index 1** is **not necessarily the hardest hole and likewise Stroke Index 18**, is **not necessarily the easiest hole**. To quote the R&A, there is "no one basic principle for fixing the order of the Stroke Index". For stroke play when all 18 or 9 holes are played, it is immaterial as to where the strokes are taken i.e. the player has x strokes per round. In match play it does matter and stroke indices 1 to 4 shouldn't be on holes 1, 2, 17 or 18 as the match may be over before the 17<sup>th</sup> or 18<sup>th</sup> hole is reached and if the match continues to the 19<sup>th</sup> it is unfair to a lower handicap player to have to give another stroke here. With two nine-hole loops and matches starting on hole 10, the same applies to holes 8, 9, 10 & 11.

The Course will be re-rated when the Council's work on the #1 drain has been completed. This will be an opportune time to re-assess the current Stroke Indices giving due consideration to all comments received from members (Men and Women).
