#### **Course** – John Sanders

The scarifying and coring recovery process continues on our greens. Last Friday a large group of helpers assisted Mark and his team to remove as much sand as possible from the greens. Although the process of blowing and raking the sand took considerably longer than expected, due to some of the sand being moist, it was all done by 6.30pm on Friday night.

This week the staff have put more sand on, raked it over and applied solid fertiliser to promote quicker growth of the grass. This was perfectly timed, as the current rain will help the process even more. I played both on Saturday and Wednesday and although naturally they are nothing like the quality of the greens prior to the maintenance, they are nonetheless playable, and it won't be too long before they will be back to normal for our winter golf.

Those of you that have played recently will have noticed that some of the fairways have started to dry out markedly recently. Mark is not concerned with this as he has purposely not been watering as much. It will be interesting to see what the drier fairways such as No 6 (Terra Nova) look like after the rain.

Thanks again to all the members that helped on the course and around the pro shop last week.

#### #1 Drain

Starting next week, phase 2 of the Drain project begins. We will provide more details soon, but I would like to share some high-level information with you.

- This phase of work is significantly larger than phase 1 and includes the section of drain from the culvert exit on the right-hand side of 10 all the way to Horseshoe Lake Road
- The entire project is scheduled to be completed by 30<sup>Th</sup> September.
- Contractor entrance to and from the course will be from Horseshoe Lake Rd near where the drain exits the course. This means construction traffic will cross the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> fairways to access the primary construction areas.
- The primary works to be completed by 30<sup>th</sup> September include:
  - o Drain naturalisation
  - o Relocation of the excavated fill to other areas on the course
  - Building the pond and associated weir
  - o Replacing all the irrigation on holes 1, 2, 9, 10 and 17.
  - o Felling trees and planting some new ones
  - o Planting a hedge along the HSL Rd boundary.
  - o Replacing all bridges.
- Works starting next week will include:
  - moving the contractors base of operations from Marks yard to the triangle area between the 10<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> fairways.
  - o felling trees along the drain path and along the fence-line by the 2<sup>nd</sup> tee.
  - Establishing safety fence lines and environmental controls
  - Starting to build an internal haul road from HSL Rd to the area between 10 and 17.
     This will run along the south side of the drain.
- Our ongoing aim is to minimise member disruption
  - o All holes will be in full play on weekends
  - During construction of the drain across 2 and 17, we will use temporary tees and greens on the both holes from Monday to Friday, as we did on 9 and 10.
- We thank you in advance for your ongoing patience while we undertake these excellent course improvements.
