There are only 40 seconds from standing next to

your ball and hitting it. Rule 5.6b - A round of golf is meant to be played at a prompt pace.

Play ready golf.

- 1) Lowest handicapper becomes the time keeper
- 2) Tee off before writing your scorecard
- 3) Think about your next shot as you walk towards your ball
- 4) Always have your clubs close to you.
- 5) Putt out and move to the next tee
- 6) Keep up with the group in front of you, not just ahead of the group behind.

Bad golf is excusable - Slow golf is not.
